Just desserts

She may have been told she was too much of a 'runt' to make it, but Anne-Marie Duff has starred as everyone from council estate matriarchs to queens. As she plays the beating heart of Sharon Horgan's dark comedy *Bad Sisters*, she talks to **Zoe Williams** about #MeToo, haters and Ray Winstone as Henry VIII

Twisted sister

Anne-Marie Duff is extremely precise. Ask her a question, and she will take great lengths to make sure her delivery is spot on, pausing for epochs to get a phrase exactly right. Even though she's famously shy, the beam of her concentrated attention makes our conversation in a central London hotel feel intimate - despite taking place in one of those artificial environments where actors gather looking sleek and shoot-ready. Sure, all actors have to inhabit the moment, but not many do that in an interview. Then again, she does have plenty to concentrate on: we're here to talk about *Bad Sisters*, the new Sharon Horgan drama - specifically, why it's so strikingly good.

"That's Sharon's writing, isn't it?" Duff says. "She's so brilliantly irreverent and funny, and cheeky. And, at the same time, full of emotional truth and compassion, and sometimes devastating heartbreak. All in a breath." If she had her way, Duff would talk exclusively about other people and how great they are. We're chatting while she's glammed up for our photoshoot, giving off a doughty, that's-the-job vibe that this level of groomed isn't really her scene. Throughout, she manages to get at least 50 paeans (to the whole cast of *Bad Sisters*, *Shameless*, the rest of her CV, plus people doing things nothing to do with her

- Steve McQueen, Lena Dunham, Suranne Jones) under the wire, however much I try to wrestle the topic back to her.

But I must insist on talking about her performance, which is the beating heart of the show: her character, Grace, is widowed at the start, and the story then goes backwards into the coercive abuse of her marriage - and the siblings who may have offed her husband. While the other four sisters have a tight, hilarious caper dynamic, Grace is isolated, "this diminished, reduced individual. We don't even know who she really is. She's just an opaque version of something. That was the tricky thing, desperately trying to make her feel like a real woman. It's like she's underwater. Where's the fifth sister? She's down there, beneath the waves."

Domestic abuse has been a longstanding cause for Duff since 2006, when she played a woman escaping a violent relationship in *Born Equal*, directed by Dominic Savage. "I had been in touch with Women's Aid and visited refuges at that time. I'd spoken to women who had been in violent scenarios, but also very coercive scenarios. It was fascinating talking to women about shame - how one of the prison bars is that you can't admit you've married someone who treats you that way. Because then who are you?"

Bad Sisters is plainly not the first show to dramatise the topic, but the scenario - four sisters very close, one set apart, her isolation

ever more intense - somehow gives it a power and palpability I've never seen before. It looks like it was no picnic to film, either, because the others get all the laughs. "I felt very isolated at times, actually, on the shoot," Duff says. "I would go 'Hi girls' as they went in to do a scene without me. It was perfect in a way, because that's how coercion works. Socially, it wasn't fantastic. In terms of being a storyteller, it was great."

It sounds like hell, but storytelling is way more important to Duff than socialising, and fiction more bearable than fact. "You're inside of a character and you're being told what to say and there's relief to that. The unpredictability and uncertainty of the real world



is terrifying. If you're in a play, you know where you are. Even if you're going to die, you know you're going to die."

The show is set in Ireland, and though Duff, 51, was born and grew up in London, both her parents are Irish. Her accent is pitch-perfect and she is proud of her dual nationality, flexing her EU passport and insisting her son has a Celtic sense of humour. She trained at the Drama Centre London, which closed down in 2020. Students used to nickname it the Trauma Centre, because everyone was so horrible. There, they told her she could forget being a lead because she was too much of a runt. "It was like an abusive relationship - you could be thrown out at any time, you could do a show and be told it was the worst thing they'd ever seen. You were always saying: 'Please love me, please love me.' Which then made the outside world seem much easier. Everyone was suddenly so supportive."

But the wider culture has changed, too. "Training used to have this principle of 'destroy to create'. Youth was a state of masochism: 'I'll do whatever it takes to make me a great artist.' Now, young people will say: 'I'll only do this emotional scene so many times, I need to protect myself.'" She's not calling young actors snowflakes; it's way more complex than that, the uneasy power dynamics of the creative industries crisscrossing the unspoken impact of class.

"I come from a very working-class background," says Duff, "so I've always had that little feeling of 'Who should an actor be? Who deserves to be one?'" Nevertheless, "it used to be that if you wanted something badly enough and worked hard enough, you'd be able to find it somehow. But now it feels that, for a lot of very working-class young people, there's a lack of belonging inside things." She describes this dense irony - that norms have changed for the better, but access has changed for the worse - so there's "a reactionary narrative that young people are all so entitled and full of self-belief. For a lot of disenfranchised people, that is bullshit."

She feels the same about the #MeToo movement, which seems to be making great strides in stamping out misogyny, but "we both know if Trump hadn't groped and Harvey [Weinstein] wasn't on his decline, #MeToo wouldn't have happened."

There were things that conspired to allow that to happen. So yes, lots of things have changed. But then look at what's just happened across the Atlantic [the overturning of Roe v Wade]. It's teeter-totter time. It feels very flammable."

Duff graduated from drama school in 1994 on a Friday, and was in rehearsals for a stage show on the Monday. She has been working nonstop, more or less - "a few blocks of unemployment but mostly by choice. Having a baby, whatever" - ever since. So you couldn't call Shameless, in 2004, a big break, since she'd already been working for a decade, on stage in London and on screen mainly in Ireland. Plus, it came after The Magdalene Sisters, a stunning film about the notorious Catholic laundries in the 60s, and "that felt like the point my life changed", Duff says, "because I'd done something on screen that was so important and so valued."

Shameless was a terrific show; huge ("It hit the zeitgeist") and "it was a sweet spot in as much as I was at the beginning, and the beginning is always delicious. Because you can paint whatever fucking panorama you want. It's like the beginning of a love affair. So in that way, it was glorious. I was at the start of the meal." (Technically it was also the beginning of a literal love affair, since she married her co-star James McAvoy; their son was born in 2010, and they divorced in 2016.)

It turbocharged her recognition, which she didn't care about at all, and put her in a new league for roles. Her next was as Elizabeth I in the BBC's The Virgin Queen (eat that, Trauma Centre - it's definitely the lead). She remembers wryly: "There was an article in Vogue asking: 'Why are they letting working-class people play royal family members?' I kid you not. Ray Winstone had not long before played Henry VIII. It was really 'Get off my land'."

She has always come across as a good-politics person, without - shy of an anti-violence against women campaign in 2007 - saying anything very political. "From a personal point of view, it would be so that it doesn't influence the work you're asked to do. Because if you define yourself as something, then people can't lose you in something else. In terms of public opinion, I know people find it quite annoying when actors start aligning themselves politically. But not in Ireland, of course, where theatre is a very political beast. Here, you're an entertainer. You're a player. That's all you're here for. You're paid for that. Shut up and do your thing."

For the first time, while filming Bad Sisters, she thought she might like to direct. "But it would be a play - directing on film is all about the team, you're much more of a captain of a ship. When you're in a rehearsal room, it's all about people communicating with each other, and that is the language that I'm fluent in. But I hate the thought that one day everyone would hate me. This happens to directors - it has to." It would be wonderful to see her direct: it feels as if she has a lot to say that "a player" can't. But sure, some people would hate it. *Bad Sisters is on Apple TV+ from Friday.*

Red Rose

This does what good horror should - makes you scared of real life. Put that phone down!

One of my big personal fears is that, one day, I'll accidentally go on Instagram Live while I'm in the toilet. We don't need to go too deep into why. It is better to focus on what will happen when I do: a small assembled crowd start to interrogate my peeing technique; I become distracted, gazing at myself in the mirror, taking my shirt off and telling myself truths, as my account starts to go viral; when I turn back to my phone, penis fully out, Doja Cat is absolutely cooking me in the comments section. Then there's the aftermath: friends will pretend they didn't see it but they did; editors will find themselves less and less likely to email; my girlfriend, after watching a recap video on the LadBible Facebook page (how is this legal?), will leave me. All told, I think the worst thing in the world to possibly happen to me would be "Have 1.2 million people watch me wee".

Oh, sorry - where was I? Ah, yes: Red Rose on BBC Three launches this Monday at 10pm, and it's about the terrifying possibilities of looking at your phone. We're in Bolton, and I'm glad we are - everyone has a very satisfying, "Hiyaluv, two chip barm please, yeah it's warm today intit?" accent - and we're following seven teenagers called, and it does feel unbelievable that I'm saying this, Wren, Roch, Taz, Noah, Ashley, Antony and Pavlov. Everyone's just done their final GCSE and has a slug of sherry, a snog in a phonebox and a fraught am-I-invited-or-not? party about it, and all they really have to worry about is whether they

can get a job this summer, whether their shoes are cool, and whether their childhood friendship is going to last a lifetime or not. And then someone downloads "Red Rose".

It's a boom time for shows about teenagers that are sort of for teenagers but often end up not being, and Red Rose - from the same production company as Sex Education, and the same writing team behind The Haunting of Bly Manor - fits neatly into that. I'm not going to tell you what's going on because I'm still not 1,000% sure, but either a ghost or an app or both is terrorising the group of deliriously named teenagers for reasons I can't quite put my finger on (again, sort of depends if it's a ghost or not).

You're right to think that, as a premise, this sounds completely silly and absurd - and not even in a delightful way - but Red Rose does two things very well: the classic, old-school, rising sense of horror; and the way the teenagers talk, text and get fed up about never having pocket money - that keeps this planted in the real world enough to work. You remember that summer after your GCSEs, don't you? You still sort of thought Wicca could be effective, you were painfully aware of how much income your parents

had compared to your friends', and you got physically sick with jealousy every time someone had even one minute of fun that didn't include you. Throw a haunted ghost app into that heady brew and they would have you screaming through the woods within seconds.

Sadly, I cannot quite tell whether Red Rose is "actually good" or "a good start that will be ruined by the shonkiness of the reveal", because I had to watch The Stranger on Netflix for this column two years ago and I am still hurt by it. For now, it's worth focusing on what it does very well. All the young actors are fantastic, the north-west setting feels genuine and deliberate rather than the result of someone going: "Where can we set this that isn't London? Come on, guys! There has to be *somewhere* in Britain that isn't London!" and pointing blindfold at a map, and it's shot like a good thriller should be (I particularly enjoy how long some of the scenes and set-pieces are allowed to go on: the opening post-exam moors party, the introductory horror movie, the walk-through-town-with-your-hands-in-your-pockets stuff).

Crucially, it will make you pause next time you blindly click "Allow Essential Cookies" on a website or grant an app access to your camera and microphone or install a complicated system of smart devices to control every single aspect of your house. This is what good horror should do: make you scared, but not constantly terrified; make you aware of the supernatural but afraid of the darkness of the real world, too; make you really, really careful about where you point your phone camera next time you go to the bathroom.

Remember the summer after your GCSEs? Now throw a haunted ghost app into that heady brew. You'd be screaming too

Pick of the week **Marriage** Sunday, 9pm, BBC One

It begins, as all great love stories do, with a married couple arguing over a jacket potato. Emma (Nicola Walker) and Ian (Sean Bean) continue to bicker on their flight back from Spain, then silently call a truce by slobbering out on the sofa with a takeaway. Not much happens in Stefan Golaszewski's new four-part drama - but that's the whole point, really. Post-holiday life resumes: a recently redundant Ian spends his day at the leisure centre and the supermarket, then their daughter brings her boyfriend over for tea. The plot may be deceptively simple, but it's brilliantly acted and delicately captures the minutiae of everyday highs and lows, interactions and well-versed small talk. *Hollie Richardson*

Pick of the day **Gary Numan Resurrection** 9pm, Sky Arts

"Wembley is the thing I've dreamed about since 1981." In this intense documentary, pop-synth icon Gary Numan reflects on stepping out of the limelight after his Farewell concert, and shows his journey back to Wembley more than 40 years later with the Intruder Tour. Fellow musicians and fans such as Dave Grohl, John Foxx and Trent Reznor also speak about Numan's legacy, and examine the pressures of heightened fame in music. *HR*

The Big Breakfast 10am, Channel 4

Two decades after it ended, Mo Gilligan and AJ Odudu hosted a one-off special of this classic morning show for Channel 4's Black to Front day last September. They're back with a weekly series, and this opening episode welcomes guests Daniel Kaluuya, Joel Dommett, Aitch and Big Has. *HR*

Alan Carr's Epic Gameshow 7pm, ITV

Is this a gameshow or a potted history of outdated quiz franchises? Both, effectively, with this episode seeing a reincarnation of Take Your Pick - a curious combo of general knowledge, randomly picking boxes and trying not to say "yes" or "no". Judging by the contestants, that last one is harder than you'd think. *Alexi Duggins*

Ahead of the Game of Thrones prequel series, Sue Perkins and her Thronecast podcast co-host Jamie East are the Targaryen hype people spending this hour preparing fans for another chapter in Westeros history. Sunday

Pick of the day **The Princess** 9pm, Sky Documentaries

What more can be said about Diana, Princess of Wales 25 years after her death? And yet this haunting documentary by the Oscar-winning team behind Man on Wire and Searching for Sugar Man lets more than 90 minutes of superbly selected archive footage do the talking. The shot of a "Don't do it, Di!" badge ahead of her royal wedding speaks volumes. *HR*

Van Der Valk 8pm, ITV

Marc Warren's gloomy detective is reluctantly thrust into the ruthless world of Amsterdam's diamond trade when his latest murder case implicates the backstabbing sibling heirs to an affluent firm. There is also a heist, of sorts, as Darrell D'Silva continues to steal scenes as pizza-guzzling pathologist Hendrik. *Graeme Virtue*

Afghanistan: Getting Out 9pm, BBC Two

Last August, the US finally withdrew its troops from Afghanistan after a 20-year war that was overseen by four different presidents. Barack Obama - and his attempts to repatriate American forces - is the focus of the first in a two-part documentary that tells the story of the war's final throes. *HR*

A Very British Way of Torture 10pm, Channel 4

Amid the current crop of films about colonial history, absent from the curriculum for many, here's one about Britain's role in a war in Kenya against the Mau Mau - a movement fighting for independence against foreign rule - in the 50s. Experts use new evidence to detail a shameful regime of systemic torture. *HR*

Walter Presents: Hide and Seek 10.55pm, Channel 4

The first ever Ukrainian offering from Channel 4's subtitled strand is a familiar-sounding but compelling police procedural - two detectives with troubled pasts investigate the disappearance of a little girl. Pick of the day **Porn King: The Rise & Fall of Ron Jeremy** 10pm, Channel 4

In this two-part documentary, female porn stars reflect on "the golden era of porn" and speak out against Ron Jeremy - who is currently facing 36 sexual assault charges, which he denies. "I was so conditioned to think that something like that was normal," recalls Alana Evans, who alleges she was groped by Jeremy. "You've only seen one side of Ron ... unless you're a victim of his," says Lianna Young, who claims that he raped her. The most shocking thing is that their accusations aren't shocking at all - and yet Jeremy continued to have a 40-year career in the industry. *HR*

Long Lost Family: What Happened Next 9pm, ITV

"It was mindblowing." As Yasika Fernando's stirring reunion with her Sri Lankan birth mother was heartbreakingly halted by the pandemic, her on-screen search resonated with a viewer - and the result, shown tonight, fostered the most unlikely of connections. Also in this episode, Paula Stillie swaps Scotland for Montana, as questions surrounding her Native American ethnicity are finally answered in person. *Danielle de Wolfe*

Westworld 9pm, Sky Atlantic

The lustre may have come off HBO's deluxe future-shock sexbot drama, but season four has veered back into what originally made it so addictive: split timelines, big twists and the return of James Marsden as upgraded host Teddy. Tonight's finale will likely leave enough dangling threads for the show to ride again. *GV*

Day of the Dead 9pm, Sky Sci-Fi

They're coming to get you, Barbara: in deepest Pennsylvania, a small town is about to burst its coffins, and six strangers must outrun the undead. 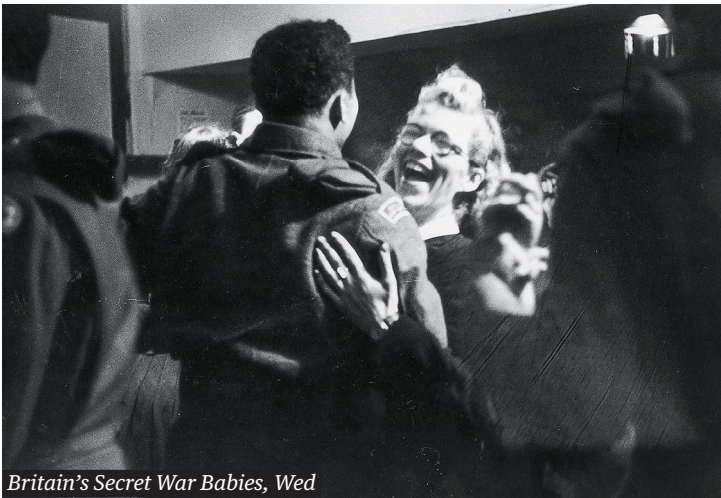

A League of Their Own

A gorgeous, warm and expansive version of the story that inspired Penny Marshall’s 1992 film: the trials and tribulations of a women’s baseball league, put together to draw in the punters during the second world war, which was then all but erased from the sport’s history. Abbi Jacobson stars as Carson, a small-town slugger who heads to Chicago to try out for the league. There, she meets a ragtag bunch of fellow baseball lovers who will become a new version of family. But this is 1943, so racism and sexism abound, as does the question of what femininity is supposed to look like. There are nods to the film, as well as revisions and updates, but in many ways this feels like a more complete version of the story. As touching as it is funny. *Rebecca Nicholson*

Tom Daley: Illegal to Be Me
BBC One/iPlayer
★★★★☆

Since he came out at the age of 19, the Olympic champion diver Tom Daley has vocally supported LGBTQ+ rights and causes. In this documentary, he addresses the fact that 35 of the 54 member states taking part in the Commonwealth Games have anti-gay legislation – and tries to prevent them from hosting the Games. Daley travels to Pakistan, where he meets a female cricketer who explains that she is seen as “a mutant”. He speaks to a closeted Nigerian athlete whose friend was lured to his death on a dating app. When he learns from the athletes in those countries that banning their nation from hosting would feel punitive and exclusionary, he changes tack. Anyone who saw his appearance at the 2022 opening ceremony will know what happened next. It is beautiful and very moving. *RN*

India 1947: Partition in Colour
Channel 4/All 4
★★★★☆

This enraging two-parter about the brutal partition of India is different to documentaries’ usual approach to the subject – and not just because the archive footage has been colourised for the first time. It’s saturated with clear-eyed truth, using film, photos and oral testimony that will break your heart, private documents that will fill it with anger, and stellar contributors – refreshingly, most of the talking heads are Indians and Pakistanis: professors, historians and authors. It tears through the year leading up to one of the greatest catastrophes of the 20th century. After all, this roll of the dice unleashed a tragedy in which a million Indians were killed, and about 15 million (possibly up to 20 million) were uprooted. *Chitra Ramaswamy*

Good Grief
Channel 4/All 4
★★★★☆

The Rev Richard Coles lost the love of his life, David, in 2019. While it is easy to regard TV as a medium in which definitive statements must be made, Good Grief does not do this. Instead, it takes Coles on a tour of the UK and beyond, meeting people who have responded to the death of a loved one by taking up quirky, cute or daunting hobbies. Coles embarks on a trip that takes in boxercise in Wellingborough, chatting to alpacas in the Cotswolds and a dinner party full of strangers in London. The wisdom Coles wants to pass on is simple. Amid the shock of loss, you can wallow in sadness, hiding from an outside world that has the temerity to continue without its most important participant. Alternatively, you can leave your comfort zone and try something challenging or superficially ridiculous. *Jack Seale*

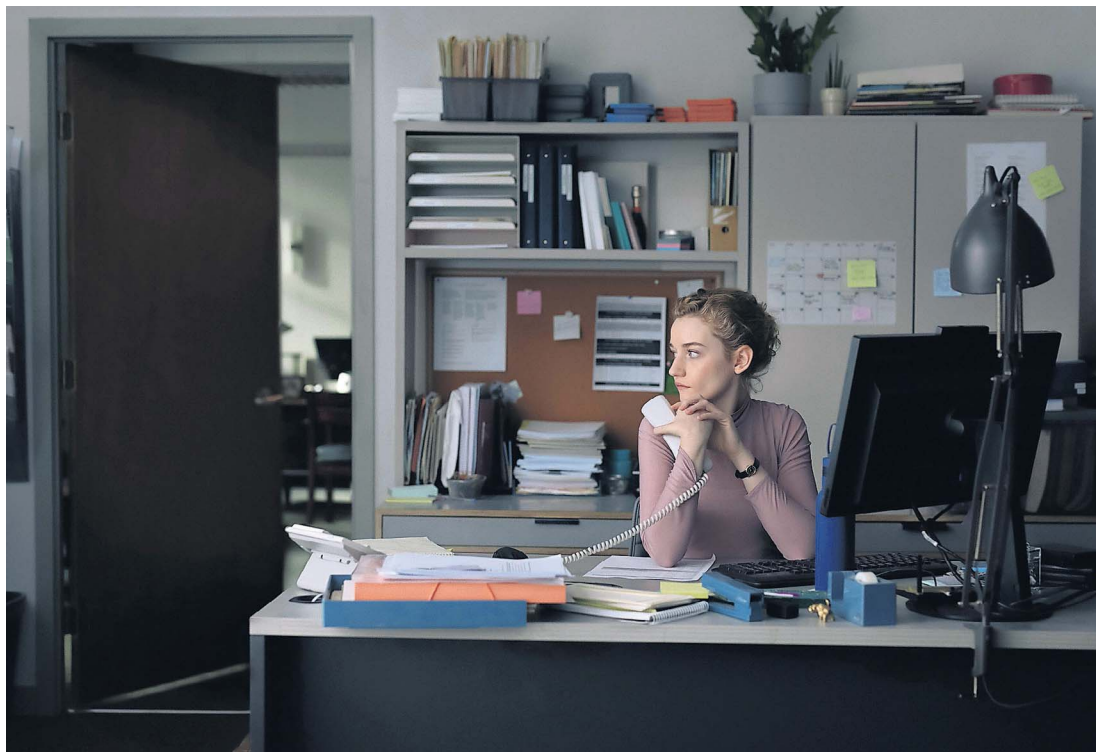

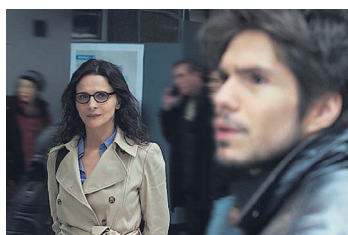

She gets intimations of his darker actions - unexplained invoices, after-hours meetings with young female actors, the appearance of a new "assistant" - but are Jane's suspicions enough to risk her position by complaining? It's the details of office culture that make the film so disturbing - how easily predatory behaviour can be excused or enabled. *Simon Wardell*



Who You Think I Am

 The perils of social media are the theme of this French drama, but the subject is not your typical youth. Middle-aged professor and single mother Claire (Juliette Binoche) is dumped by her twentysomething lover. She takes revenge by creating a fake Facebook profile - 24-year-old Clara - and befriending his flatmate Alex. Through texts and phone chats, a relationship with Alex grows, one Claire deludes herself into thinking represents the real her. Safy Nebbou's film sensitively unpicks Claire's desires and insecurities, all expressed exquisitely by Binoche. *SW*

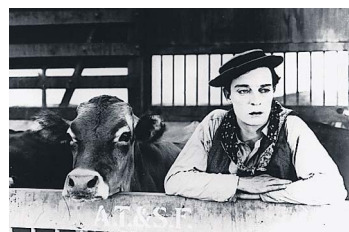


Sisters With Transistors

Saturday, 10.30pm, Sky Arts
 A roll call of largely unsung female electronic music pioneers are the focus of Lisa Rovner's fascinating historical primer. From 1930s theremin soloist Clara Rockmore and BBC Radiophonic Workshop co-founder Daphne Oram to 60s soundscape artist Pauline Oliveros and the advert-soundtracking Suzanne Ciani, all found creative autonomy away from the establishment via tape loops, circuit boards and synthesisers. With a trove of performance footage, it's a laudatory tale of enforced DIY careers and untameable imaginations. *SW*

Go West

Sunday, 1pm, Talking Pictures TV
 Buster Keaton takes his deadpan comedy to the wild west in this 1925 film, which culminates in one of his great set-pieces - a riotous cattle drive through the streets of L.A. His impoverished nobody Friendless is knocked around by life but imperturbable, so when he finds himself at a ranch and poses as a cowboy, his inability to do the simplest tasks - he can't put a saddle on, thinks cows milk themselves - doesn't stop him for long. He even wins the heart of the owner's daughter, though he's more concerned about Brown Eyes, a very independent-minded steer. *SW*



120 BPM

Sunday, 1.10am, Film4
 The campaigns and characters of Aids activist group Act Up in Paris in the early 1990s make for compelling, emotional drama in Robin Campillo's 2017 film. Amid the argumentative meetings about strategy and the disruptive public actions themselves (often involving fake blood), the heartbreaking stories of the mostly HIV-positive members slip through. It's also a sweet love story - as new boy Nathan (Arnaud Valois) falls for the ailing but angry Sean (a terrifically bolshie Nahuel Pérez Biscayart). *SW*

Saint Frances

Thursday, 11.15pm, Film4
 Kelly O'Sullivan scripts and stars in a wonderfully frank look at women's health issues. She plays Bridget, 34, a waitress with little in the way of maternal instinct, who gets a job nannying wilful but cute six-year-old Frances (Ramona Edith Williams) while one of the girl's two mothers, Maya (Charin Alvarez), struggles with her new baby. There is plenty in the relationship between Bridget and Frances to captivate but the film is most interesting when it deals with the women and their problems - menstruation, abortion, postpartum depression; topics getting an all-too rare airing on screen. *SW*



The Invisible Man

 This is the first adaptation of HG Wells's sci-fi novel that privileges the point of view of the victim - and the result is the finest version of the story so far. In Leigh Whannell's chiller, we follow Elisabeth Moss's Cecilia as she flees an abusive, controlling relationship, only to suspect her ex, a wealthy optics engineer, is stalking her - even after he supposedly kills himself. Moss is exceptional, alternately fragile and forceful, while the film's air of suspense is maintained through a camera that is either creeping along corridors or lurking, unnervingly static. *SW*

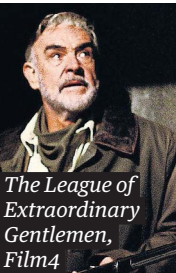
