They are known for their riotous comedy, from performing the conga backwards to rapping about vacuum cleaners. Now - despite Alex Horne not playing an instrument and the Horne Section never acting before - they have their own musical sitcom. **Emma John** meets the band and their Taskmaster frontman

The barn stormers

Alex Horne stands in front of a camera, arms hanging limply by his side and a worried look on his face. The barn he's in has been converted into a talkshow set, complete with guest sofa, an audience made up of crew members and extras, and a five-piece band who hover expectantly behind him. Horne looks characteristically put-upon, the way we're used to seeing him as Greg Davies's assistant in *Taskmaster*, the way anyone would look if they were trying to host live TV from their own house.

Except this isn't actually his house. It's not a real chatshow either, but rather the premise for his new sitcom, *The Horne Section TV Show*. It is, however, his real band. The Horne Section have grown into one of the UK's most popular musical comedy acts over the past decade, with national tours, a much-loved podcast and frequent light entertainment appearances, from 8 out of 10 Cats Do Countdown to Peter Crouch: Save Our Summer. Their creative silliness manifests in many ways, from lip-syncing a backwards conga, to performing the macarena as a high-stakes blindfolded tango, to a rapping Henry vacuum cleaner ("Force my little nose on your dirty carpet / I couldn't give a toss it's quite cathartic"). And if their songs have yet to reach the charts they remain ear worms par excellence,

from an ode to everyone's favourite former health secretary, Hat Mancock, to the catchy Chris Hoy Loves a Saveloy.

Now they are starring in their own Channel 4 comedy, scripted by Horne and based on the joyfully meta premise that they've only ended up with a show thanks to a mistake by a Channel 4 commissioning editor.

The resultant homemade vibe - Horne booking guests in his kitchen and rehearsing the band in the basement - is the perfect fit for an act whose comedy riffs on its shambolic nature. The scene being filmed is a musical collaboration between the band's trumpeter, Joe Auckland, and guest Big Zuu, who is currently rapping about how much he hates donkeys. Big Zuu is

improvising, because until a couple of hours ago he thought he was turning up to do genuine TV chat. The confusion, very much in the spirit of the show, has demanded some hasty line learning.

Watching from the other side of the camera is bass player Will Collier, absent from this scene because, according to the script, he's trapped elsewhere. On his phone is a video Auckland sent him the night before, practising dance moves in his pants. "We've been filming together for five weeks now," says Collier, "so the silliness levels have really topped out. Plus we have to do so many takes we honestly can't tell what's funny any more."

Acting has been daunting for five jazz musicians, who have never improvised away from their

instruments before. After filming the pilot last year, they cringed so hard when they watched it they assumed Channel 4 would cancel it. Instead it provided acting lessons, which saxophonist Mark Brown describes as “awful”, and Collier as “terrifying”. “The teacher wanted us to ‘let go’, but I don’t let go, so I just pretended to,” Collier pauses. “That’s acting, right?”

This tale of how a bunch of session musicians became sitcom stars is four decades in the making. Horne has been friends with Auckland and drummer Ben Reynolds since primary school. Brown was Auckland’s housemate at music college, and they performed in a band with Collier. When they were working at the Edinburgh Jazz Festival, and Horne was doing standup at the fringe, they would attend each other’s gigs.

To this day Horne claims to detest jazz. “But I liked Joe’s trumpet solos,” he says, “because I knew when to clap at the end of them.” “We’d get drunk and say we should do something with music and comedy,” says Brown. The idea was repeated fruitlessly for years until Horne finally beatboxed with them at a Ronnie Scott’s gig. The Horne Section debuted at the fringe in 2010; they had only written a couple of songs, but with special guests every night, from Tim Minchin to Sara Pascoe, their anarchic shows could run for more than two hours. Brown says it helped that by the time they went on stage, around midnight, “everyone was belted”.

The format of their live shows – daft songs the musicians write themselves (sea shanties about biscuits, Vivaldi’s Four Seasons rewritten as a pizza recipe) strung together with deadpan jokes by Horne – proved equally successful as a Radio 4 series and a podcast. Horne has no musical qualifications beyond grade three in French horn, but that’s part of the joke; he fronts the band like a petty autocrat, and bluffs his way through the singing. The band provide the perfect comic foil, a bunch of sweet-natured, shambolic sidemen who seem genuinely happy just to be there.

Their chemistry is equally authentic off-stage. “We’ve just got closer over the years,” says keyboard player Ed Sheldrake. “Well, we’ve literally moved miles apart from each other,” counters Horne. The Horne Section is a sidehustle for them all – Taskmaster takes up most of Horne’s time, while the musicians back major acts from Robbie Williams to Madness to Noel Gallagher – but they do seem to miss each other when they’re apart.

Landing their own TV show has been an unrealised dream for years. They have appeared as the house band on panel shows, from Never Mind the Buzzcocks to The Last Leg, but even Horne’s rising star and the runaway success of Taskmaster struggled to secure them their own gig. In 2018 they filmed The Horne Section Television Programme for Dave, and Horne was “pretty sure we would get a series out of that”. Brown says: “We couldn’t have been more wrong.”

It didn’t help that the band used up all their songs. “That was Dave’s idea,” says Auckland. “They

thought: ‘If we get them to put all their material in this one, they won’t be able to do any more.’ And yet what *has* got commissioned,” says Collier, baffled, “is us *acting*.”

The sitcom script is studded with their experiences in the industry. When Horne tells the Channel 4 executive, played by Georgia Tennant, that there’s no music on TV, she responds that there’s Jools Holland and the theme tune to the news. Even their awkward pitch to the channel is true to form, though it’s safe to say that the real-life version didn’t have John Oliver adding unhelpful commentary via video call.

Persuading other people to appear was not so easy, and the sheer silliness of what they might be asked to do – think Anneka Rice having a mushroom flashback – put off a few. But those who ended up on the show have proved thoroughly game: you’ll never see Dr Ranj in the same light.

“He had the hardest job,” says Horne, who cast the affable daytime doctor in an unusually aggressive role. “He had to throw his microphone across the set,” says Sheldrake. “They put a mattress off-camera for him to throw it at, but he kept missing and smashing the scenery.” Another favourite cameo was Imogen Heap, who happens to own the property they were filming at. “In between shots she said: ‘Let’s have a little jam,’” says Reynolds. “Usually we got in trouble for messing around but this time they couldn’t stop us because it was her idea.” “And her house,” says Brown.

The sitcom’s plot is interspersed with music videos that could easily pass for sincere if you didn’t pay attention to the lyrics – the one about pea-farming reels you all the way in before knocking you out with its punchline chorus. Horne wrote the initial pilot in two and a half days, and says it’s easy to write for characters you already know. Each of the band plays an exaggerated version of themselves: Brown is grumpy and too cool to be involved, Auckland deems himself “the village idiot”. Horne objects: “I think you’re a savant, aren’t you?” “I don’t know what that is,” says Auckland.

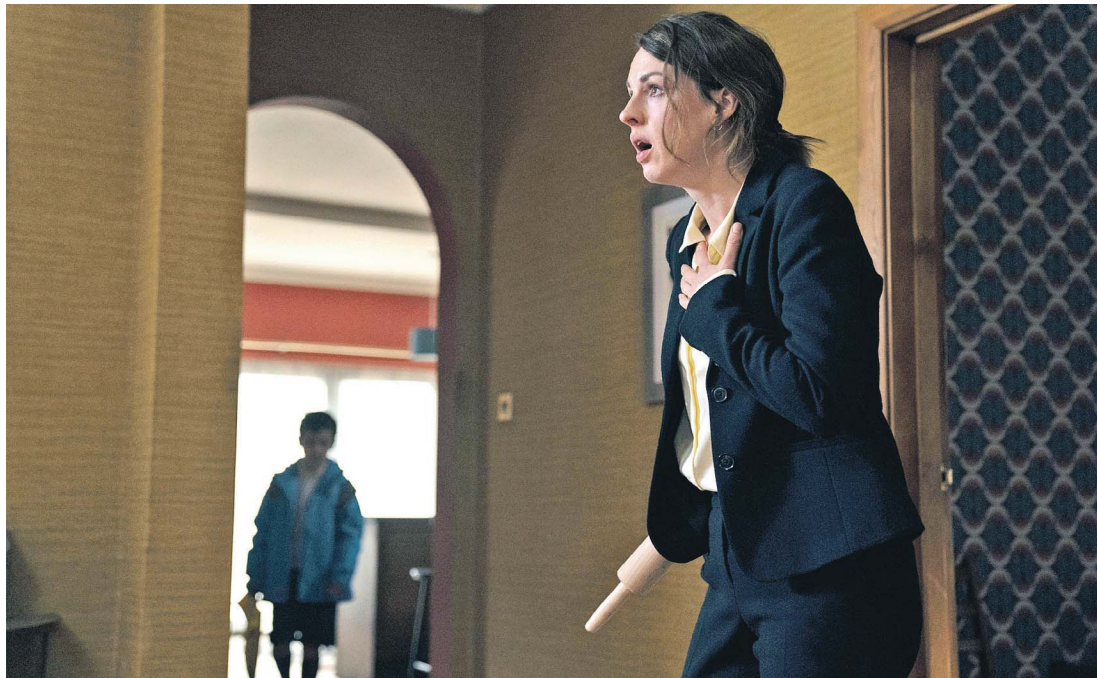
The band’s WhatsApp group is bursting with skits, song ideas and scenarios for another script – after all, they would like to make the most of their new acting skills. Sheldrake, for instance, has learned that if you write a funny song about being naked, you’ll end up having to perform it to camera in flesh-coloured pants. Auckland now knows that if a script calls for you to raise one eyebrow but you physically can’t, you should really tell someone before you get to set. “That was two days wasted, wasn’t it?” says Brown.

Brown says they miss the audience interaction of their live tour, not to mention the service station food, but Auckland has noticed one advantage to telly: “It’s over quicker,” he points out. “It’s been a learning curve,” says Horne, “but we got better.” He looks at Sheldrake. “Didn’t we?” *The Horne Section TV Show will be on All 4 from 3 November and will air on Channel 4 soon.*

The Devil’s Hour

A freaky little creep boy walking around in the dead of night is perfect Halloween viewing

I think it would be really fun to cast a child actor in the role of “freaky little creep”. It can’t be fun casting child actors for literally any role other than that. Can you imagine the plummy audition tapes you have to trudge through. The unbearable earnestness of their polite little voices! The whispering encouragement of parents off screen! How weirdly unconvincing children are when you ask them to play a “child”? No wonder the industry tried to get as many movies out of Macaulay Culkin as possible before puberty got to him. He was the only kid who could ever act.

Anyway, there’s a weird little creep boy in *The Devil’s Hour* (from Friday, Prime Video), you will be pleased to hear. He’s really horrible. He’s always staring through windows at nothing while not blinking. Every time you hug him in the dead of night he goes: “Mummy, who’s that man?” then you turn round, afraid, and stare at nothing. All his teachers are frightened of him. His own father is frightened of him. He looks like he’s cold to the touch. He waves too slowly to be in any way normal. I want him very far away from me.

The Devil’s Hour has all the component parts to be very, very good. It has Peter Capaldi back in intense, unblinking, talking-with-his-bottom-teeth-out mode, which is where he’s at his best. Jessica Raine is doing a superb job as Lucy, the whirring centre of the whole thing: she’s playing the three roles of “haunted woman who keeps jolting awake at 3.33am after a recurring nightmare”, “firm but caring boss at the underfunded

social services unit” and “mum to a creepy little horrible goth boy”, and doing each of them from a really interesting, charming new angle. Nikesh Patel’s first scene is him doing the most unconvincing cigarette smoke I’ve ever seen committed to screen, but then he starts to bite into the dense role they’ve created for him as the wunderkind detective with a grizzled Scottish partner.

There’s something intricate and spooky going on – shades of that first series of *True Detective* before the bad finale – and even the one-scene supporting actors have been well cast: every false lead they interrogate, every blind alley they run up, is fun to watch unfold. People walk carefully into rooms plastered with a man’s scribbles while holding a torch up to see a picture of their own face. People come home to find that, hmmm, that’s odd, I swear I locked that door before I left this morning. Time is moving incorrectly. Visions keep appearing in bursts. Something is going on.

However, I can’t quite tell if it is good or not. This is mainly because *The Devil’s Hour* suffers from that curious trick ambitious limited

series on streaming platforms seem to love playing, which is “an incredibly steep drop-off from the first episode to the second”. The series opener is great – tense and taut, playing with time and nightmare and good old-fashioned horror tropes. It’s a skilled little magic show (the domestic horror of Lucy’s job is just as woefully terrifying as that weird little kid she has at home who knows everyone’s full names before he’s ever met them). We’ve seen “one detective is old and does it the old way, one detective is young and does it the new way” one hundred billion times before, but Nikesh Patel and Alex Ferns seem to be doing something new with it. It’s great.

And then: eh, episode two. Capaldi still hasn’t quite turned up yet. None of the keys have been turned in their locks. The fear with a series this intricate is that none of the foundational work ever leads to a satisfying reveal. As anyone who has watched *Westworld* knows: as soon as TV starts playing with time to keep important information from you, you have to worry.

Still, Halloween, isn’t it. When the leaves start turning red on the trees, all you can really think is: I simply must see a creepy little boy in pyjamas walk stiffly around his own house in the dead of night. Oh! Oh, darling, you gave me a fright. Come on, let’s get you back to bed. Did you have a nightmare? What’s that sweetheart, I can’t hear you ... Right. I’d really like you to stop hissing threats in an ancient and terrifying demon’s voice, now. It’s really not nice. I’ve got enough going on with work and Peter Capaldi without you pulling this too. Go to sleep, you little freak.

Expect a smörgåsbord of dark delights from a starry and lavish series, such as the claustrophobic and nauseating battle between grave-robber and vermin in *Graveyard Rats* (above), and Tim Blake Nelson having a terrifying subterranean adventure in *Lot 36*. With horrors ranging from the subtly quotidian to the opulently gothic, it's a perfect treat for Halloween. *Phil Harrison*



The BMF Documentary: Blowing Money Fast

Demetrius "Big Meech" and Terry "Southwest T" Flenory were the BMF (Black Mafia Family), a Detroit crime syndicate that operated from the mid-80s to 2005, when the DEA came calling. This documentary series (produced by Curtis "50 Cent" Jackson, who also had a hand in a drama about the organisation in 2021) explores the turf wars, the massive drug deals, the wildly extravagant parties and eventually, the downfall of the organisation. The archive footage is plentiful and striking but the tone never quite feels rigorous enough for the brutal subject matter. *PH*



Women of Steel

It has been a landmark year for mainstream representation of women's sport. If that's mainly thanks to the triumphant England women's football team, the rugby league side will be hoping for a similar profile boost. Across its various platforms, the BBC will be broadcasting every game from the Women's Rugby League World Cup - and this documentary will introduce you to the team and tell their stories. Via intimate, behind-the-scenes access, we meet a team of gifted amateurs as they hold down jobs while preparing for an international tournament. *PH*



Grey's Anatomy

"You will save lives with this equipment. And you will end them." A new batch of interns have arrived in Grey Sloan Memorial Hospital and they're preparing to learn some life-and-death lessons. We've now reached season 19 of this drama and the formula remains the same - white-coated romantic intrigue jostles for space with white-knuckle medical action. Showrunner Shonda Rhimes always imbues her work with nuance, though, so if Grey's Anatomy sometimes feels predictable, it's always stylish and well constructed. *PH*

The Mysterious Benedict Society

This adventure series adapted from Trenton Lee Stewart's novels has the look and feel of a Wes Anderson film aimed at slightly eccentric young adults. His brother is back in action and has a new plan with mind-controlling, world-threatening potential. The Bastard Son & the Devil Himself

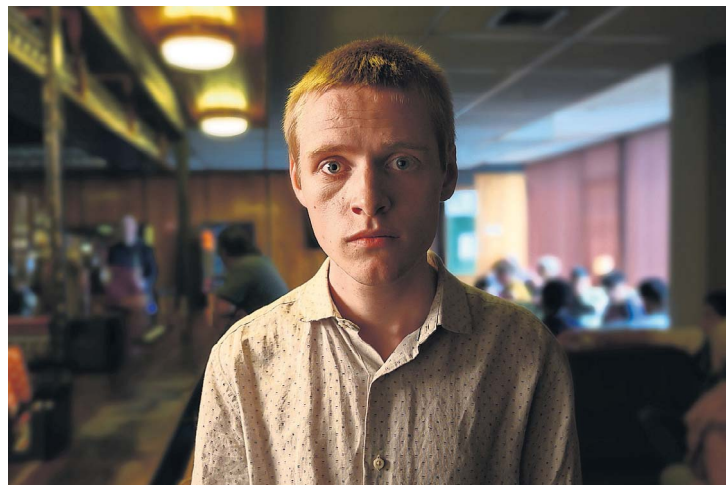

It is about starting again and fitting in; trauma and abuse; family and love; and monsters, both figurative and literal. Every episode, Danny learns more about his past. This lends it the slowburn satisfaction of a really good thriller, though it is much more than that. It is often drily funny, too. *Somewhere Boy* is something special.

A real-life story that reads like an overbaked horror novel? Murphy must have been waiting for this his entire life. The cast is absolutely berserk: Bobby Cannavale, Naomi Watts, Mia Farrow and Jennifer Coolidge - who seems as if she walked on set having accidentally prepared for a completely different series. But it is a seven-part whodunnit about a typewriter. Hey, at least it’s better than that godawful Jeffrey Dahmer thing. *Stuart Heritage*

Untold: Inside the Shein Machine
Channel 4/All 4

Shein’s clothes are priced so competitively, customers don’t mind if they only wear them once or not at all. We learn here how the app and website are precisely engineered to create an “infinite scroll” that is colourful and addictively friendly but loaded with “dark patterns”, the marketing term for techniques designed to make people buy on impulse. Reporter Iman Amrani makes the point that the conditions documented by *Untold*’s undercover reporters - exhausted staff working for up to 18 hours a day, often seven days a week, being paid 2-3p per piece sewn - cannot be a revelation. People know what they are buying. The problem is that they don’t care. *Jack Seale*

Amol Rajan Interviews Greta Thunberg
BBC Two/iPlayer

What must it be like, at 19, to be the most recognised climate crisis campaigner in the world? What does shouldering the burden of the biggest calamity humanity has ever faced feel like? Amol Rajan spends large parts of this 45-minute interview reflecting mainstream discourse on climate - which is to say, he risks sounding ignorant in order to give commonplace gotchas an airing. The sport is in how efficiently Thunberg can knock down these questions. It’s not all such a struggle. Thunberg often has a refreshingly unguarded response to daft statements: her reaction to Rajan sincerely intoning “There is one individual looming over this debate - and that’s Elon Musk” is untrammelled giggling. But if Thunberg has given herself the task of communicating the climate crisis urgency, this programme proves it is a terribly difficult job. *JS*

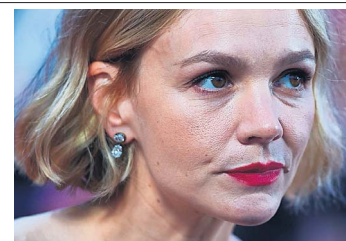

Queen of Katwe

 Chess has long been used in fiction as a metaphor for life - The Queen's Gambit being the most recent example - and in Mira Nair's compelling fact-based drama it is set against the hard-scrabble reality of growing up in a slum in Kampala, Uganda. Ten-year-old Phiona (Madina Nalwanga) has a prodigious talent for the game and, under the guidance of teacher Robert (David Oyelowo), gets a glimpse of the opportunities success could bring. One Cut of the Dead

 For its first half-hour, this is a behind-the-scenes film about the making of a low-budget zombie horror whose director introduces the actual undead on to the set. It's all wittily meta - and a logistical triumph for the (real) director Shin'ichirô Ueda - with those odd camera angles or unexplained slices of dialogue revealed to be the result of panicked improvisation due to drunk actors, technical errors or understudies going off-script. *SW*

The Good Nurse

 Normally, butter wouldn't melt in Eddie Redmayne's mouth, but he puts our expectations to the test in this unsettling true-life crime drama. He plays Charlie, a helpful new ICU nurse at a New Jersey hospital alongside Amy (a convincingly shattered-looking Jessica Chastain). She has serious coronary issues and no insurance, so is wary of whistleblowing when patients start dying unexpectedly. Tobias Lindholm's film highlights the culpability of the profit-hungry healthcare firms enabling Charlie, but it's Redmayne's enigmatic performance that really chills. *SW*



Don't Look Now

 Nicolas Roeg's stylish, unnerving 1973 adaptation of a Daphne du Maurier short story confirmed the former cinematographer as a master of twisted storytelling as well as of arresting images. It tells the tale of architect John (Donald Sutherland) and his wife Laura (Julie Christie) who, after the fatal drowning of their daughter, go to a wintry Venice for work. There, a psychic tells them she can see their child, which brings comfort to Laura but sets John on a fateful path. Brilliantly horrific. *SW*

Out now, Netflix
 Coraline creator Henry Selick's penchant for the morbid side of life is given free rein in this highly entertaining animated fantasy, with the assistance of Jordan Peele as co-writer and voice actor. Lyric Ross plays Kat, rebellious 13-year-old orphan and, it transpires, "hell maiden" to the titular demons (Keegan-Michael Key and Peele, bringing all their comic double act skills into play). The duo are desperate to get to the land of the living, and Kat is to be their conduit. A refreshingly modern take on its fairytale set-up added to Selick's eye for exquisite detail makes repeat viewing all but essential. *SW*



All Quiet on the Western Front

 Erich Maria Remarque's anti-war novel is something of a set text in Germany, so it's surprising Edward Berger's drama is the first native film version. And it doesn't disappoint, following naive young recruit Paul (Felix Kammerer) into the dirt and viscera and terror of the first world war battlefield. Paul doesn't get much of a backstory but, as with the lead character in Sam Mendes's 1917, we are compelled to follow his nightmarish journey. There is a desolate beauty here - and a subplot about armistice negotiations gives context - but the moral message is deafening. *SW*

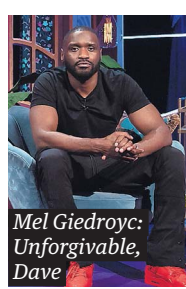

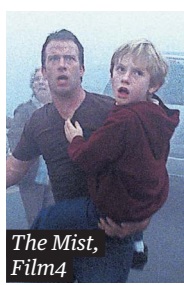

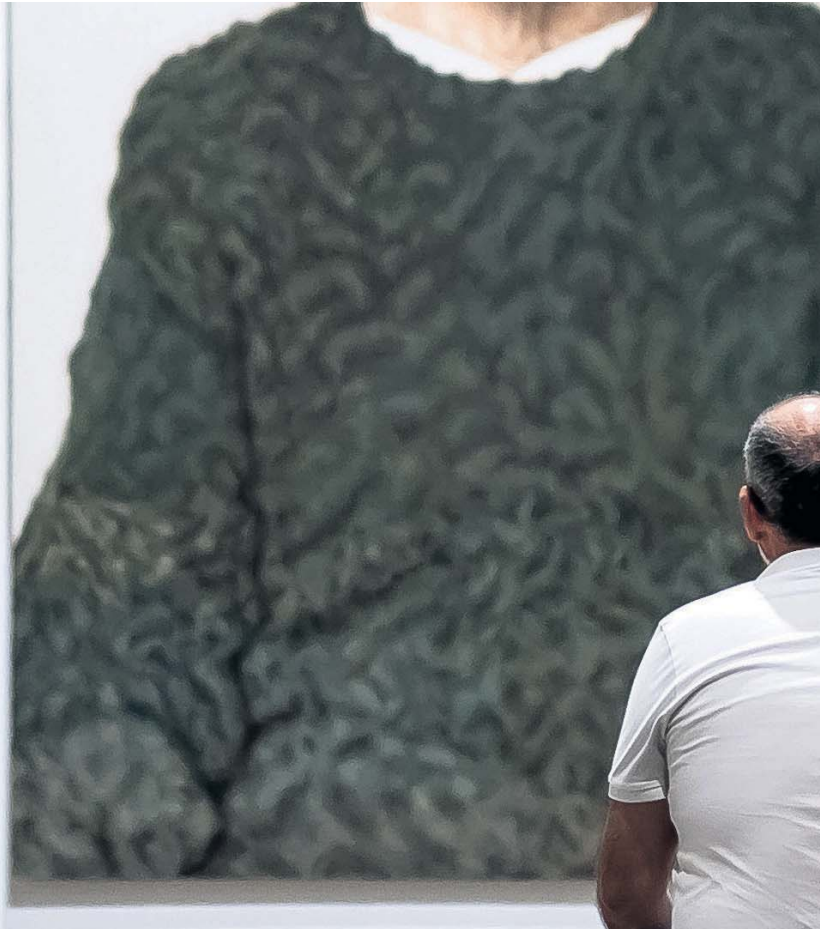
